Mr. FIELDS of Texas introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to provide that Federal judges be reconfirmed by the Senate every 10 years.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled*
3 *(two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-*
4 *lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-*
5 *stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all*
6 *intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when*
7 *ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several*

1 States within seven years after the date of its submission
2 for ratification:

3 “ARTICLE —

4 “Notwithstanding section 1 of article III of this Con-
5 stitution, a judge or justice of a court created under that
6 article shall not continue in office, except with the consent
7 of the Senate, given within the first 365 days at the begin-
8 ning of each successive 10-year period after the judge or
9 justice first takes office. For the purposes of this article
10 of amendment, a judge or justice who first took office be-
11 fore the adoption of this article shall be deemed to have
12 first taken office on the date of such adoption.”.
