A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on certain textile spinning machines.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN TEXTILE SPINNING MACHINES.**

4 Subchapter II of chapter 99 of the Harmonized Tar-
5 iff Schedule of the United States is amended by inserting
6 in numerical sequence the following new heading:

“	9902.84.52	Textile machines for spinning man-made fibers (provided for in subheading 8445.20.00), and their associated parts, accessories, and equipment (provided for in subheading 8448.39.10), the foregoing machines having winders with variable speeds with a maximum take-up speed of 5,000 meters per minute, when imported as an entirety	Free	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/95	”.
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1 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

2 The amendment made by section 1 applies with re-
3 spect to articles entered, or withdrawn from warehouse for
4 consumption, on or after the 15th day after the date of
5 the enactment of this Act.

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
