Mr. INOUYE introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Army to determine the validity of the claims of certain Filipinos that they performed military service on behalf of the United States during World War II.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. DETERMINATIONS BY THE SECRETARY OF THE**

4 **ARMY.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Upon the written application of

6 any person who is a national of the Philippine Islands,

7 the Secretary of the Army shall determine whether such

8 person performed any military service in the Philippine Is-

1 lands in aid of the Armed Forces of the United States
2 during World War II which qualifies such person to re-
3 ceive any military, veterans', or other benefits under the
4 laws of the United States.

5 (b) INFORMATION TO BE CONSIDERED.—In making
6 a determination for the purpose of subsection (a), the Sec-
7 retary shall consider all information and evidence (relating
8 to service referred to in subsection (a)) available to the
9 Secretary, including information and evidence submitted
10 by the applicant, if any.

11 **SEC. 2. CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE.**

12 (a) ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE.—The
13 Secretary shall issue a certificate of service to each person
14 determined by the Secretary to have performed service de-
15 scribed in section 1(a).

16 (b) EFFECT OF CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE.—A cer-
17 tificate of service issued to any person under subsection
18 (a) shall, for the purpose of any law of the United States,
19 conclusively establish the period, nature, and character of
20 the military service described in the certificate.

21 **SEC. 3. APPLICATIONS BY SURVIVORS.**

22 An application submitted by a surviving spouse, child,
23 or parent of a deceased person described in section 1(a)
24 shall be treated as an application submitted by such per-
25 son.

1 **SEC. 4. LIMITATION PERIOD.**

2 The Secretary may not consider for the purpose of
3 this Act any application received by the Secretary more
4 than two years after the date of the enactment of this Act.

5 **SEC. 5. PROSPECTIVE APPLICATION OF DETERMINATIONS**

6 **BY THE SECRETARY OF THE ARMY.**

7 No benefits shall accrue to any person for any period
8 prior to the date of the enactment of this Act as a result
9 of the enactment of this Act.

10 **SEC. 6. REGULATIONS.**

11 The Secretary shall issue regulations to carry out sec-
12 tions 1, 3, and 4.

13 **SEC. 7. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ADMINISTRATOR OF**
14 **VETERANS' AFFAIRS.**

15 Any entitlement of a person to receive veterans' bene-
16 fits by reason of this Act shall be administered by the Vet-
17 erans' Administration pursuant to regulations issued by
18 the Administrator of Veterans' Affairs.

19 **SEC. 8. DEFINITIONS.**

20 As used in this Act—

21 (1) the term "World War II" means the period
22 beginning on December 7, 1941, and ending on De-
23 cember 31, 1946; and

24 (2) the term "Secretary" means the Secretary
25 of the Army.
