A BILL

To extend the suspension of duty on certain diamond tool
and drill blanks, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF**

4 **DUTY.**

5 Heading 9902.71.04 (relating to certain diamond tool
6 and drill blanks) of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of
7 the United States is amended by striking out “12/31/92”
8 and inserting “12/31/95”.

1 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by this Act
3 applies with respect to articles entered, or withdrawn from
4 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
5 the date of the enactment of this Act.

6 (b) RELIQUIDATION.—Notwithstanding section 514
7 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision of law,
8 upon proper request filed with the appropriate customs of-
9 ficer on or before the 90th day after the date of the enact-
10 ment of this Act, any entry of an article described in sub-
11 heading 9902.71.04 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of
12 the United States that was made—

13 (1) after December 31, 1992, and

14 (2) before the date which is 15 days after the
15 date of the enactment of this Act,

16 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such entry
17 occurred on or after the date that is 15 days after the
18 date of the enactment of this Act.

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
