Mr. INOUE introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Armed Services

## A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to authorize former members of the Armed Forces who are totally disabled as the result of a service-connected disability to travel on military aircraft in the same manner and to the same extent as retired members of the Armed Forces are entitled to travel on such aircraft.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3       That chapter 53 of title 10, United States Code, is  
4       amended by inserting after section 1031 the following new  
5       section:

1 **“§ 1032. Travel privileges on military aircraft for cer-**  
2 **tain former members of the armed forces**

3 “A former member of the armed forces who is enti-  
4 tled to compensation from the Veterans’ Administration  
5 for a service-connected disability rated total in degree by  
6 the Veteran’s Administration is entitled, in the same man-  
7 ner and to the same extent as retired members of the  
8 armed forces are entitled to travel on a space-available  
9 basis on unscheduled military flights within the continen-  
10 tal United States and on scheduled overseas flights oper-  
11 ated by the Military Airlift Command.”.

12 SEC. 2. The table of sections, at the beginning of  
13 chapter 53 of title 10, United States Code, is amended  
14 by inserting after the item relating to section 1031 the  
15 following new item:

“1032. travel privileges on military aircraft for certain former members of the  
armed forces.”.
