Mr. LAUTENBERG (for himself and Mr. BRADLEY) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To extend the suspension of duty on certain narrow fabric weaving machines.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. SUSPENSION OF DUTY.

4 Heading 9902.84.42 of the Harmonized Tariff
5 Schedule of the United States (relating to power-driven
6 weaving machines for weaving fabrics not exceeding 30cm
7 in width) is amended by striking “12/31/92” and inserting
8 “12/31/98”.

9 SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.

10 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by sub-
11 section (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or with-

1 drawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after the
2 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act.

3 (b) RETROACTIVE APPLICATION.—Notwithstanding
4 section 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514)
5 or any other provision of law, upon proper request filed
6 with the appropriate customs officer before the 90th day
7 after the date of the enactment of this Act, any entry,
8 or withdrawal from warehouse for consumption, of any
9 good described in heading 9902.84.42 of the Harmonized
10 Tariff Schedule of the United States that was made—

11 (1) after December 31, 1992; and
12 (2) before the 15th day after the date of the en-
13 actment of this Act;
14 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such entry
15 or withdrawal occurred on the 15th day after the date of
16 the enactment of this Act.
