A BILL

To amend the provisions of title 39, United States Code, to provide that certain periodical publications shall not be bound publications for mail classification purposes, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN PERIODICAL PUBLICATIONS EX-**
4 **CLUDED FROM CLASSIFICATION AS BOUND**
5 **PUBLICATIONS.**

6 Section 3626 of title 39, United States Code, is
7 amended—

1 (1) by redesignating the second subsection (k)
2 as subsection (l); and

3 (2) by adding at the end thereof the following
4 new subsection:

5 “(m) In the administration of this section, a weekly
6 periodical publication which is eligible to publish legal no-
7 tices under the laws of any State, the pages of which were
8 customarily secured by two staples before March 19, 1989,
9 shall not be considered to be a bound publication for mail
10 classification purposes solely because its pages continue to
11 be secured by two staples after that date.”.
