Ms. MOSELEY-BRAUN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To renew the previously existing suspension of duty on parts of aircraft generators.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PARTS OF AIRCRAFT GENERATORS.**

4 Heading 9902.85.03 of the Harmonized Tariff
5 Schedule of the United States is amended by striking
6 “12/31/92” and inserting “12/31/94”.

7 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by section
9 1 applies with respect to goods entered, or withdrawn from

1 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
2 the date of the enactment of this Act.

3 (b) RETROACTIVE PROVISION.—Notwithstanding sec-
4 tion 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision
5 of law, upon a request filed with the appropriate customs
6 officer on or before the 90th day after the date of the
7 enactment of this Act, any entry, or withdrawal from
8 warehouse for consumption, of an article described in
9 heading 9902.85.03 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of
10 the United States that was made—

11 (1) after December 31, 1992; and

12 (2) before the 15th day after the date of the en-
13 actment of this Act;

14 and with respect to which there would have been no duty
15 or a lower duty if the amendment made by section 1 had
16 applied to such entry or withdrawal, shall be liquidated
17 or reliquidated as though such entry or withdrawal oc-
18 curred on such 15th day.
