Mr. BRADLEY (for himself and Mr. LAUTENBERG) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

Regarding the suspension of duty on diflunisal.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SUSPENSION OF DUTY ON DIFLUNISAL.**

4 Heading 9902.30.23 of the Harmonized Tariff
5 Schedule of the United States is amended by striking out
6 “12/31/92” and inserting “12/31/95”.

7 **SEC. 2. APPLICABILITY.**

8 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—The amendment made by section
9 1 applies with respect to goods entered, or withdrawn from
10 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after
11 the date of the enactment of this Act.

1 (b) RETROACTIVE PROVISION.—Notwithstanding sec-
2 tion 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision
3 of law, upon proper request filed with the appropriate cus-
4 toms officer within 180 days after the 15th day after the
5 date of the enactment of this Act, any entry or withdrawal
6 from warehouse—

7 (1) that was made after December 31, 1992,
8 and before such 15th day; and

9 (2) with respect to which there would have been
10 no duty if the amendment made by section 1 applied
11 to such entry or withdrawal;
12 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such amend-
13 ment applied to such entry or withdrawal.

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
