Mr. MURKOWSKI (for himself and Mr. STEVENS) introduced the following bill;
which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Banking, Hous-
ing, and Urban Affairs

A BILL

To remove the restrictions on the export of Alaskan North
Slope oil, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXPORT ADMINISTRATION ACT AMENDMENT.**

4 Section 7(d) of the Export Administration Act of
5 1979 (50 U.S.C. App. 2406(d)) is repealed.

6 **SEC. 2. TRANSPORT REQUIREMENT.**

7 The export of domestically produced crude oil shall
8 be transported in vessels documented under the laws of
9 the United States which are eligible to engage in the coast-
10 wise trade if such crude oil is transported by pipeline over

1 right-of-way granted pursuant to section 203 of the
2 Trans-Alaska Pipeline Authorization Act (43 U.S.C.
3 1652).

4 **SEC. 3. OTHER PROVISIONS OF LAW.**

5 The export of domestically produced crude oil trans-
6 ported by pipeline over right-of-way granted pursuant to
7 section 203 of the Trans-Alaska Pipeline Authorization
8 Act (43 U.S.C. 1652) shall not be subject to the restric-
9 tions contained in section 28(u) of the Mineral Leasing
10 Act (30 U.S.C. 185(u)), section 103 of the Energy Policy
11 and Conservation Act (42 U.S.C. 6212), section 28 of the
12 Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act (43 U.S.C. 1354), or
13 section 7430(e) of title 10, United States Code, or any
14 regulations issued under any such provision of law.

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
