A BILL

To prohibit the imposition of additional fees for attendance by United States citizens at the United States Merchant Marine Academy.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON IMPOSITION OF ADDITIONAL
4 CHARGES OR FEES FOR ATTENDANCE AT
5 THE UNITED STATES MERCHANT MARINE
6 ACADEMY.**

7 (a) PROHIBITION.—Except as provided in subsection
8 (b), no charge or fee for tuition, room, or board for attend-

1 ance by United States citizens at the United States Mer-
2 chant Marine Academy may be imposed.

3 (b) EXCEPTION.—The prohibition specified in sub-
4 section (a) shall not apply with respect to any item or serv-
5 ice provided to midshipmen at the United States Merchant
6 Marine Academy for which a charge or fee is imposed as
7 of the date of the enactment of this Act. The Secretary
8 of Transportation shall notify the Congress of any change
9 made by the United States Merchant Marine Academy in
10 the amount of a charge or fee authorized under this sub-
11 section.
