A BILL

To make permanent the temporary exemption from duty of the cost of certain foreign repairs made to United States vessels.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PERMANENT EXEMPTION.**

4 (a) AMENDMENT.—Subsection (b)(2) of section 484E
5 of the Customs and Trade Act of 1990 (19 U.S.C. 1466
6 note) is amended to read as follows:

7 “(2) any entry made on or after the date upon
8 which the Act becomes effective.”.

9 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
10 subsection (a) shall take effect on January 1, 1993.
