A BILL

To extend until January 1, 1996, the existing suspension of duty on tamoxifen citrate.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF EXISTING SUSPENSION.**

4 Heading 9902.30.45 of the Harmonized Tariff
5 Schedule of the United States is amended by striking “12/
6 31/92” and inserting “12/31/95”.

7 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in subsection
9 (b), the amendment made by section 1 applies with respect
10 to goods entered, or withdrawn from warehouse for con-

1 sumption, on or after the 15th day after the date of the
2 enactment of this Act.

3 (b) RETROACTIVE APPLICATION.—Notwithstanding
4 section 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514)
5 or any other provision of law to the contrary, upon a re-
6 quest filed with the appropriate customs officer before the
7 90th day after the date of the enactment of this Act, any
8 entry or withdrawal from warehouse for consumption—

9 (1) which was made after December 31, 1992,
10 and before the 15th day after the date of the enact-
11 ment of this Act; and

12 (2) with respect to which there would have been
13 no duty if the amendment made by section 1 applied
14 to such entry or withdrawal;
15 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such amend-
16 ment applied to such entry or withdrawal.
