Mr. BRYAN (for himself and Mr. REID) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To extend the suspension of duty on three-dimensional cameras.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF SUSPENSION OF DUTY ON
4 THREE-DIMENSIONAL CAMERAS.**

5 Heading 9902.90.06 of the Harmonized Tariff
6 Schedule of the United States is amended by striking out
7 “12/31/92” and inserting in lieu thereof “12/31/96”.

8 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

9 The amendment made by section 1 applies with re-
10 spect to articles entered, or withdrawn from warehouse for
11 consumption, after December 31, 1992.

1 **SEC. 3. CERTAIN ENTRIES.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding section 514 of
3 the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision of law, the
4 Secretary of the Treasury, upon proper request filed with
5 the appropriate customs officer within one hundred and
6 eighty days after the date of the enactment of this Act,
7 shall—

8 (1) reliquidate each entry which occurred after
9 December 31, 1992, and before the effective date of
10 this Act at the rate of duty that would have been as-
11 sessed if that entry had been made on December 31,
12 1992; and

13 (2) make the appropriate refund of duty.

14 Such reliquidations and refunds shall be made within one
15 hundred and eighty days after the date on which the re-
16 quest is made.
