Mr. ROTH introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To continue until January 1, 1995, the suspension of duty on o-Benzl-p-chlorophenol.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. O-BENZL-P-CHLOROPHENOL.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subheading 9902.29.09 of the
5 Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (19
6 U.S.C. 3007) is amended by striking out “12/31/90” and
7 inserting “12/31/94”.

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) shall apply with respect to goods entered,

1 or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, after
2 December 31, 1990.

3 (c) RELIQUIDATION.—

4 (1) GENERAL RULE.—Notwithstanding section
5 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision
6 of law, upon proper request filed with the appro-
7 priate customs officer on or before the date which is
8 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act,
9 any entry of an article described in heading
10 9902.29.09 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of
11 the United States—

12 (A) which was made after December 31,
13 1990, and before such date of enactment; and

14 (B) with respect to which there would have
15 been a lesser duty if the amendment made by
16 this section applied to such entry;

17 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such
18 amendment applied to such entry.

19 (2) ENTRY.—For purposes of paragraph (1),
20 the term “entry” includes any withdrawal from
21 warehouse.

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
