Mr. BRADLEY (for himself and Mr. LAUTENBERG) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on jacquard cards and other cards used as jacquard cards.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF DUTY SUSPENSION.**

4 Headings 9902.39.27 and 9902.48.23 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States are
6 each amended by striking “12/31/92” and inserting
7 “12/31/94”.

8 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendments made by this
10 Act shall apply with respect to articles entered, or with-

1 drawn from warehouse for consumption, after the date
2 that is 15 days after the date of the enactment of this
3 Act.

4 (b) RELIQUIDATION.—Notwithstanding section 514
5 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision of law,
6 upon a request filed with the appropriate customs officer
7 before the date that is 90 days after the date of the enact-
8 ment of this Act, any entry, or withdrawal from warehouse
9 for consumption, of an article described in heading
10 9902.39.27 or 9902.48.23 of the Harmonized Tariff
11 Schedule of the United States that was made—

12 (1) after December 31, 1992, and

13 (2) on or before the date that is 15 days after
14 the date of the enactment of this Act,

15 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such entry
16 or withdrawal occurred on the day after the date that is
17 15 days after the date of the enactment of this Act.
