# A BILL

To prohibit discrimination by the Armed Forces on the basis of sexual orientation.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON DISCRIMINATION IN THE  
4 MILITARY ON THE BASIS OF SEXUAL ORI-  
5 ENTATION.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—No member of the Armed Forces,  
7 or person seeking to become a member of the Armed  
8 Forces, may be discriminated against by the Armed  
9 Forces on the basis of sexual orientation.

1       (b) PRESERVATION OF RULES AND POLICIES RE-  
2 GARDING SEXUAL MISCONDUCT.—Nothing in subsection  
3 (a) may be construed as requiring the Armed Forces to  
4 modify any rule or policy regarding sexual misconduct or  
5 otherwise to sanction or condone sexual misconduct, but  
6 such rules and policies may not be applied in a manner  
7 that discriminates on the basis of sexual orientation.
