A BILL

To extend the existing suspension of duty on machines designed for heat-set, stretch texturing of continuous manmade fibers.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF EXISTING SUSPENSION OF**
4 **DUTY ON MACHINES DESIGNED FOR HEAT-**
5 **SET, STRETCH TEXTURING OF CONTINUOUS**
6 **MANMADE FIBERS.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.84.44 of the Har-
8 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended
9 by striking “12/31/92” and inserting “12/31/95”.

10 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—

1 (1) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by
2 subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered,
3 or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on
4 or after the 15th day after the date of the enact-
5 ment of this Act.

6 (2) RETROACTIVE APPLICATION TO CERTAIN
7 ENTRIES.—Notwithstanding section 514 of the Tar-
8 riff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514) or any other provi-
9 sion of law, upon proper request filed with the ap-
10 propriate customs officer before the 90th day after
11 the date of the enactment of this Act, any entry, or
12 withdrawal from warehouse for consumption, of any
13 goods described in heading 9902.84.44 of the Har-
14 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States that
15 was made—

16 (A) after December 31, 1992; and

17 (B) before the 15th day after the date of
18 the enactment of this Act;

19 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such
20 entry or withdrawal occurred on the 15th day after
21 the date of the enactment of this Act.
