Mr. THURMOND introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To extend the temporary suspension of duty on Paramine Acid.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PARAMINE ACID.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.30.44 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States is amended
6 by striking “12/31/92” and inserting “12/31/97”.

7 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—

8 (1) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered,
10 or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on

1 or after the date which is 15 days after the date of
2 the enactment of this Act.

3 (2) RETROACTIVE APPLICATION.—Notwith-
4 standing section 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or
5 any other provision of law, upon proper request filed
6 with the appropriate customs officer on or before the
7 date which is 90 days after the date of the enact-
8 ment of this Act, any entry of an article described
9 in heading 9902.30.44 of the Harmonized Tariff
10 Schedule of the United States that was made—

11 (A) after December 31, 1992, and

12 (B) before the date which is 15 days after
13 the date after the enactment of this Act,
14 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such
15 entry occurred on or after the date that is 15 days
16 after the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
