Mr. DANFORTH introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To extend the suspension of duty on triallate.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. TRIALLATE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.29.60 of the
5 Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating
6 to S-2,3,3-trichloroallyl diisopropylthiocarbamate) is
7 amended by—

8 (1) striking “S-(2,3,3’-trichloroallyl)diisopropyl-
9 thiocarbamate” and inserting “S-2,3,3-trichloroallyl
10 diisopropylthiocarbamate”; and

11 (2) striking “12/31/92” and inserting “12/31/
12 95”.

1 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—

2 (1) IN GENERAL.—The amendments made by
3 subsection (a) apply with respect to goods entered,
4 or withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on
5 or after the 15th day after the date of the enact-
6 ment of this Act.

7 (2) RETROACTIVE APPLICATION TO CERTAIN
8 ENTRIES.—Notwithstanding section 514 of the Tar-
9 iff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514) or any other provi-
10 sion of law, upon proper request filed with the ap-
11 propriate customs officer before the 90th day after
12 the date of the enactment of this Act, any entry, or
13 withdrawal from warehouse for consumption, of any
14 goods described in heading 9902.29.60 of the Har-
15 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States that
16 was made—

17 (A) after December 31, 1992; and

18 (B) before the 15th day after the date of
19 the enactment of this Act;

20 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though the
21 amendments made by subsection (a) applied to such
22 entry or withdrawal.

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
