RESOLUTION

To express the sense of the Senate that the identification of trade liberalization priorities under “Super 301” should be made permanent.

Whereas foreign barriers to United States exports have contributed to the Nation’s trade deficits, and are threatening the loss of manufacturing jobs, the erosion of our tax base, the decline in the strength of the United States economy and of the American standard of living, and the vitality of the technological, industrial, and agricultural base of the United States; and

Whereas the President should have the appropriate tools for combating unfair and predatory trade practices that

threaten American manufacturing and service industries
and agriculture: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That it is the sense of the Senate that not
2 later than December 15, 1993, amendments to section 310
3 of the Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2420) should be en-
4 acted to establish the permanent requirement that not
5 later than April 30th of each year the United States Trade
6 Representative shall identify trade liberalization priorities
7 under “Super 301”.

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
