Mr. MITCHELL submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

## RESOLUTION

To amend the Standing Rules of the Senate to require a three-fifths vote to overturn the chair post-cloture.

1       *Resolved*, That rule XXII of the Standing Rules of  
2 the Senate is amended by striking the “.” at the end of  
3 paragraph 3 of section 2 and inserting in lieu thereof the  
4 following: “, such appeals shall require an affirmative vote  
5 of three-fifths of the Senators duly chosen and sworn—  
6 except on a measure or motion to amend the Senate rules,  
7 in which case the necessary affirmative vote shall be two-  
8 thirds of the Senators present and voting.”.
