RESOLUTION

To amend the Standing Rules of the Senate to provide one motion to go to conference with the House.

- 1 *Resolved*, That rule XV of the Standing Rules of the Senate is amended by adding the following:

That whenever the Senate has in its possession a measure that has been passed by both Houses it shall be in order, once the measure has been placed before the Senate, to make one nondivisible motion that contains the following: to insist on the Senate amendment(s), or disagree to the House amendment(s); to request a conference with the House on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses, or agree to the request of the House for the same;
