Mr. FORD, from the Committee on Rules and Administration, reported the following original resolution; which was placed on the calendar

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Rules and Administration.

1 *Resolved*, That in carrying out its powers, duties, and
2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
4 rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings,
5 and making investigations as authorized by paragraph 1
6 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate,
7 the Committee on Rules and Administration is authorized
8 from March 1, 1993, through February 28, 1994, and
9 March 1, 1994, through February 28, 1995, in its discre-

1 tion (1) to make expenditures from the contingent fund
2 of the Senate, (2) to employ personnel, and (3) with the
3 prior consent of the Government department or agency
4 concerned and the Committee on Rules and Administra-
5 tion, to use on a reimbursable or nonreimbursable basis
6 the services of personnel of any such department or
7 agency.

8 SEC. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the
9 period March 1, 1993, through February 28, 1994, under
10 this resolution shall not exceed \$1,478,578, of which
11 amount (1) not to exceed \$4,000 may be expended for the
12 procurement of the services of individual consultants, or
13 organizations thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of
14 the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended),
15 and (2) not to exceed \$3,500 may be expended for the
16 training of the professional staff of such committee (under
17 procedures specified by section 202(j) of the Legislative
18 Reorganization Act of 1946).

19 (b) For the period March 1, 1994, through February
20 28, 1995, expenses of the committee under this resolution
21 shall not exceed \$1,511,163, of which amount (1) not to
22 exceed \$4,000 may be expended for the procurement of
23 the services of individual consultants, or organizations
24 thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative
25 Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended), and (2) not to

1 exceed \$3,500 may be expended for the training of the
2 professional staff of such committee (under procedures
3 specified by section 202(j) of the Legislative Reorganiza-
4 tion Act of 1946).

5 SEC. 3. The committee shall report its findings, to-
6 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
7 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
8 date, but not later than February 28, 1994, and February
9 28, 1995, respectively.

10 SEC. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
11 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
12 upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the commit-
13 tee, except that vouchers shall not be required (1) for the
14 disbursement of salaries of employees paid at an annual
15 rate, or (2) for the payment of telecommunications pro-
16 vided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Door-
17 keeper, United States Senate, or (3) for the payment of
18 stationery supplies purchased through the Keeper of the
19 Stationery, United States Senate, or (4) for payments to
20 the Postmaster, United States Senate, or (5) for the pay-
21 ment of metered charges on copying equipment provided
22 by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeepers,
23 United States Senate, or (6) for the payment of Senate
24 Recording and Photographic Services.

1 SEC. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
2 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
3 pensation of employees of the committee from March 1,
4 1993, through February 28, 1994, and March 1, 1994,
5 through February 28, 1995, to be paid from the Appro-
6 priations account for “Expenses of Inquiries and Inves-
7 tigations.”
