Authorizing expenditures by the Select Committee on Intelligence.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

Mr. DECONCINI, from the Select Committee on Intelligence, submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Select Committee on
Intelligence.

1 *Resolved*, That in carrying out its powers, duties, and
2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
4 rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings,
5 and making investigations as authorized by paragraphs 1
6 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate,
7 the Select Committee on Intelligence is authorized from
8 March 1, 1993, through February 28, 1994, and March
9 1, 1994, through February 28, 1995, in its discretion (1)
10 to make expenditures from the contingent fund of the Sen-

1 ate, (2) to employ personnel, and (3) with the prior con-
2 sent of the Government department or agency concerned
3 and the Committee on Rules and Administration, to use
4 on a reimbursable or non-reimbursable basis the services
5 of personnel of any such department or agency.

6 SEC. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the
7 period March 1, 1993, through February 28, 1994, under
8 this resolution shall not exceed \$2,938,578 of which
9 amount (1) not to exceed \$30,000 may be expended for
10 the procurement of the services of individual consultants,
11 or organizations thereof (as authorized by section 202(i)
12 of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amend-
13 ed).

14 (b) For the period March 1, 1994, through February
15 28, 1995, expenses of the committee under this resolution
16 shall not exceed \$3,003,123 of which amount (1) not to
17 exceed \$30,000 may be expended for the procurement of
18 the services of individual consultants, or organizations
19 thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative
20 Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended).

21 SEC. 3. The committee shall report its finding to-
22 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
23 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
24 date, but not later than February 28, 1994, and February
25 28, 1995, respectively.

1 SEC. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
2 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
3 upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the commit-
4 tee, except that vouchers shall not be required (1) for the
5 disbursement of salaries of employees paid at an annual
6 rate, or (2) for the payment of telecommunications pro-
7 vided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Door-
8 keeper, United States Senate, or (3) for the payment of
9 stationery supplies purchased through the Keeper of the
10 Stationery, United States Senate, or (4) for payments to
11 the Postmaster, United States Senate, or (5) for the pay-
12 ment of metered charges on copying equipment provided
13 by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper,
14 United States Senate, or (6) for the payment of Senate
15 Recording and Photographic Services.

16 SEC. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
17 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
18 pensation of employees of the committee from March 1,
19 1993, through February 28, 1994, and March 1, 1994
20 through February 28, 1995, to be paid from the Appro-
21 priations account for “Expenses of Inquiries and Inves-
22 tigations.”
