## A BILL

To provide for a reduction in regulatory costs by maintaining Federal average fuel economy standards applicable to automobiles in effect at current levels until changed by law, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
2       tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. AVERAGE FUEL ECONOMY STANDARDS.**

4       Beginning on the date of enactment of this Act, the  
5       average fuel economy standards established (whether di-  
6       rectly or indirectly) under regulations promulgated by the  
7       Secretary of Transportation under chapter 329 of title 49,

1 United States Code, prior to the date of enactment of this  
2 Act for automobiles (as that term is defined in section  
3 32901 of title 49, United States Code) that are in effect  
4 on the day before the date of enactment of this Act, shall  
5 apply without amendment, change, or other modification  
6 of any kind (whether direct or indirect) for—  
7 (1) the model years specified in the regulations;  
8 (2) the applicable automobiles specified in the  
9 regulations last promulgated for such automobiles;  
10 and  
11 (3) each model year thereafter;  
12 until chapter 329 of title 49, United States Code, is spe-  
13 cifically amended to authorize an amendment, change, or  
14 other modification to such standards or is otherwise modi-  
15 fied or superseded by law.
