## A BILL

To extend the exemption for certain unliquidated vessel  
repair entries, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. EXEMPTION REGARDING CERTAIN VESSEL RE-**  
4       **PAIRS.**

5       Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the duty  
6       imposed by subsection (a) of section 466 of the Tariff Act  
7       of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1466(a)) shall not apply to any entry  
8       made during the period beginning on January 1, 1993,  
9       and ending on December 31, 1994, to the extent such  
10      entry involves the cost of sandblasting, painting, or other-

1 wise modifying in a foreign country 65 newly acquired  
2 LASH (Lighter Aboard Ship) barges documented under  
3 the laws of the United States, if—

4           (1) such entry was not liquidated as of January  
5       1, 1995, and

6           (2) such entry had been made on January 1,  
7       1995, such entry would otherwise be eligible for the  
8       exemption provided by section 466(h)(1) of the Tar-  
9       iff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1466(h)(1)).
