3 **SECTION 1. LIMITATION ON DESIGNATION AS BENE-**
4 **FICIARY DEVELOPING COUNTRY.**

5 Section 502(b)(6) of the Trade Act of 1974 (19
6 U.S.C. 2462(b)(6)) is amended to read as follows:

7 “(6) if—

1 “(A) such country aids or abets, by grant-
2 ing sanctuary from prosecution to, any individ-
3 ual or group which committed an act of inter-
4 national terrorism, or

5 “(B) the Secretary of State makes a deter-
6 mination with respect to such country under
7 section 6(j)(1)(A) of the Export Administration
8 Act of 1979; and”.
