RESOLUTION

To require the Select Committee on Ethics of the Senate to hold hearings in any case involving a Senator in which the committee determines that there is substantial credible evidence which provides substantial cause to conclude that a violation within the jurisdiction of the Select Committee has occurred.

2 SECTION 1. ETHICS HEARINGS INVOLVING SERIOUS ETH-

3 ICS VIOLATIONS BY MEMBERS.

4 Section 2(d)(5) of Senate Resolution 338, agreed to

5 July 24, 1964, is amended by inserting after the first sen-

6 tence the following: "The Select Committee shall hold

1 hearings in any investigation conducted under subpara-
2 graph (A) that involves a complaint against a Member.
3 The hearing requirement may be waived by the Select
4 Committee by a recorded majority vote of the members
5 of the Select Committee.”.

6 **SEC. 2. APPLICATION OF AMENDMENT.**

7 The amendment made by section 1 shall apply to any
8 investigation within the jurisdiction of the Select Commit-
9 tee on Ethics pending on the date of adoption of this reso-
10 lution and any investigation commenced after the date of
11 adoption.
