Mr. CAMPBELL introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To provide for the conveyance of an unused Air Force housing facility in La Junta, Colorado, to the City of La Junta.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. LAND CONVEYANCE, AIR FORCE HOUSING FA-
4 CILITY, LA JUNTA, COLORADO.**

5 (a) CONVEYANCE REQUIRED.—The Secretary of the
6 Air Force shall convey, without consideration, to the City
7 of La Junta, Colorado (in this section referred to as the
8 “City”), all right, title, and interest of the United States
9 in and to the unused Air Force housing facility, consisting

1 of approximately 28 acres and improvements thereon, lo-
2 cated within the southern most boundary of the City.

3 (b) PURPOSES OF CONVEYANCE.—The purposes of
4 the conveyance under subsection (a) may include (among
5 any other purposes) the following:

6 (1) To assist the City to relieve the housing
7 shortage in the La Junta area.

8 (2) To provide a location for the provision of
9 early childhood education services.

10 (3) To provide additional dormitory space for
11 Otero Junior College.

12 (4) To provide a source of funds for capital im-
13 provements to the existing dormitory on the campus
14 of Otero Junior College.

15 (c) DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY.—The exact acreage
16 and legal description of the property to be conveyed under
17 subsection (a) shall be determined by a survey satisfactory
18 to the Secretary. The cost of the survey shall be borne
19 by the City.

20 (d) ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS.—The
21 Secretary may require such additional terms and condi-
22 tions in connection with the conveyance under subsection
23 (a) as the Secretary considers appropriate to protect the
24 interests of the United States.
