A BILL

To amend the Agricultural Adjustment Act to allow for the continued dissemination of statistical industry information relating to olive handlers with the consent of those handlers.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION ALLOWED.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 8d(2) of the Agricultural
5 Adjustment Act (7 U.S.C. 608d(2)), reenacted with
6 amendments by the Agricultural Marketing Agreement
7 Act of 1937, is amended by striking “or (B)” and insert-
8 ing “(B) in the case where there are only two regulated

1 handlers of olives, the issuance of general statements
2 based upon the reports of those handlers when both han-
3 dlers have submitted to the Secretary written, signed con-
4 sent to the release of such information, or (C)’’.

5 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
6 subsection (a) shall take effect on August 1, 1999.
