A BILL

To provide that the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall include an estimate of Federal retirement benefits for each Member of Congress in their semiannual reports, and for other purposes.

3 SECTION 1. DISCLOSURE OF ESTIMATES OF FEDERAL RE-

RETIREMENT BENEFITS OF MEMBERS OF CONGRESS.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 105(a) of the Legislative
7 Branch Appropriations Act, 1965 (2 U.S.C. 104a; Public

1 Law 88-454; 78 Stat. 550) is amended by adding at the
2 end the following new paragraph:

3 “(4) The Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of
4 the House of Representatives shall include in each semi-
5 annual report submitted under paragraph (1), with re-
6 spect to Members of Congress, as applicable—

7 “(A) the total amount of individual contribu-
8 tions made by each Member to the Civil Service Re-
9 tirement and Disability Fund and the Thrift Savings
10 Fund under chapters 83 and 84 of title 5, United
11 States Code, for all Federal service performed by the
12 Member as a Member of Congress and as a Federal
13 employee;

14 “(B) an estimate of the annuity each Member
15 would be entitled to receive under chapters 83 and
16 84 of such title based on the earliest possible date
17 to receive annuity payments by reason of retirement
18 (other than disability retirement) which begins after
19 the date of expiration of the term of office such
20 Member is serving; and

21 “(C) any other information necessary to enable
22 the public to accurately compute the Federal retire-
23 ment benefits of each Member based on various as-
24 sumptions of years of service and age of separation
25 from service by reason of retirement.”.

1 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section shall take effect
2 1 year after the date of the enactment of this Act.
