A BILL

To amend chapter 75 of title 5, United States Code, to provide that any Federal law enforcement officer who is convicted of a felony shall be terminated from employment.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. MANDATORY TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT**

4 **OF FEDERAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS**

5 **CONVICTED OF FELONIES.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 75 of title 5, United

7 States Code, is amended by adding after subchapter V the

8 following:

1 “SUBCHAPTER VI—MANDATORY TERMINATION OF
2 EMPLOYMENT OF LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

5 “(a) In this section, the term—

6 “(1) ‘conviction date’ means the date on which
7 a conviction of a felony is entered by a Federal or
8 State court, regardless of whether that conviction is
9 appealed or is subject to appeal; and

10 “(2) ‘Federal law enforcement officer’ has the
11 meaning given that term under section 115(c)(1) of
12 title 18.

13 "(b) Any Federal law enforcement officer who is con-
14 victed of a felony shall be terminated from employment
15 on the last day of the first applicable pay period following
16 the conviction date.

17 “(c) This section does not prohibit the termination
18 of employment before a conviction date.”.

19 (b) TECHNICAL AND CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—
20 The table of sections for chapter 75 of title 5, United
21 States Code, is amended by adding after the item relating
22 to section 7543 the following:

“SUBCHAPTER VI—MANDATORY TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT
OF LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

“7551. Mandatory termination of employment of law enforcement officers convicted of felonies.”.
