CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Recognizing the many contributions of Timothy John Lynch, Sr., to the East Bay, California, community.

Whereas Timothy John Lynch, Sr., was born in San Francisco on July 20, 1917, and graduated from St. James High School;

Whereas Timothy Lynch served his country honorably as a Captain in the United States Army Air Corps during World War II;

Whereas on June 13, 1942, Timothy Lynch married Mary-Louise Leach of San Mateo, California, with whom he had 7 children—William, Kathleen, James, Timothy Jr., Teresa, Patricia, and Jean Louise;

Whereas Timothy Lynch realized the need for a park in his community of Pleasant Hill, and joined with other resi-

dents in 1950 to purchase the land known today as Pleasant Hill Park on Gregory Lane;

Whereas Timothy Lynch's active support for the community resulted in his being elected to the Board of Trustees for the Pleasant Hill Parks and Recreation Department;

Whereas, in addition to his support of community recreation, Timothy Lynch helped Pleasant Hill incorporate and become a city;

Whereas Timothy Lynch was appointed to the Contra Costa County Planning Commission and served on the Commission for 10 years, the first Commissioner to represent Pleasant Hill and Lafayette;

Whereas Timothy Lynch served on the Saint Mary's College of California President's Advisory Council and actively raised funds for the college; and

Whereas Timothy Lynch volunteered extensively in his community, and upon retirement, volunteered over 30 hours per week at Kaiser Hospital and the Contra Costa Medical Center: Now, therefore, be it
