A BILL

To provide that a person who brings a product liability action in a Federal or State court for injuries sustained from a product that is not in compliance with a voluntary or mandatory standard issued by the Consumer Product Safety Commission may recover treble damages, and for other purposes.

1 **SECTION 1. DAMAGE RECOVERIES.**

2 (a) TREBLE DAMAGES.—Any person who brings a
3 product liability action in a Federal or State court for in-
4 juries sustained from the use of a product that is not in
5 compliance with a voluntary or mandatory standard issued
6 by the Consumer Product Safety Commission shall recover
7 treble damages.

8 (b) NOTICE.—Within 90 days of the date of enact-
9 ment of this Act, the Consumer Product Safety Commis-
10 sion shall reissue each voluntary and mandatory standard
11 the Commission has for a product with a notice notifying
12 manufacturers of such products of the treble damage pro-
13 vision of subsection (a).
