Mrs. LOWEY submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Government Reform

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Congress that a commemorative postage stamp should be issued in honor of Helen Hayes.

Whereas Helen Hayes was one of the most well-known figures in the entertainment field, with a career that spanned 80 years and 9 decades;

Whereas Helen Hayes is 1 of only 2 women to have received all 4 prestigious entertainment awards: 2 Tonys, 2 Oscars, an Emmy, and a Grammy;

Whereas Helen Hayes is considered the “First Lady of the American Theater”; and

Whereas Helen Hayes, while known mostly for her entertainment personality, also contributed greatly to the United States and the world through her philanthropic efforts:

Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring), That it is the sense of the Congress that—*

3 (1) a commemorative postage stamp should be
4 issued in honor of Helen Hayes; and

5 (2) the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee of
6 the United States Postal Service should recommend
7 to the Postmaster General that such a stamp be
8 issued.
