- 3 (1) the United States Postal Service should
- 4 issue a commemorative postage stamp to promote
- 5 public awareness of Down syndrome; and
- 6 (2) the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee
- 7 should recommend to the Postmaster General that
- 8 such a stamp be issued.
