Mr. DOMENICI introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Armed Services

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## A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to provide entitlement to health care for reserve officers of the Armed Forces pending orders to initial active duty following commissioning.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. ELIGIBILITY OF RESERVE OFFICERS FOR**

4       **HEALTH CARE PENDING ORDERS TO ACTIVE**

5       **DUTY FOLLOWING COMMISSIONING.**

6       Section 1074(a) of title 10, United States Code, is

7       amended—

8               (1) by inserting “(1)” after “(a)”;

3 (3) by adding at the end the following new  
4 paragraph:

5       “(2) Members of the uniformed services referred to  
6 in paragraph (1) are as follows:

7               “(A) A member of a uniformed service on active  
8               duty.

9               “(B) A member of a reserve component of a  
10          uniformed service who has been commissioned as an  
11          officer if—

12                             “(i) the member has requested orders to  
13                             active duty for the member’s initial period of  
14                             active duty following the commissioning of the  
15                             member as an officer;

“(iv) the member does not have health care insurance and is not covered by any other health benefits plan.”.

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
