A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to exempt certain members of the Armed Forces from the requirement to pay subsistence charges while hospitalized.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXEMPTION OF CERTAIN MEMBERS OF THE
4 ARMED FORCES FROM REQUIREMENT TO
5 PAY SUBSISTENCE CHARGES WHILE HOS-
6 PITALIZED.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1075 of title 10, United
8 States Code, is amended—

5 “(b) EXCEPTIONS.—Subsection (a) shall not apply to
6 any of the following:

7 “(1) An enlisted member, or former enlisted
8 member, of a uniformed service who is entitled to re-
9 tired or retainer pay or equivalent pay.

10 “(2) An officer or former officer of a uniformed
11 service, or an enlisted member or former enlisted
12 member of a uniformed service not described in
13 paragraph (1), who is hospitalized under section
14 1074 of this title because of an injury or disease in-
15 curred (as determined under criteria prescribed by
16 the Secretary of Defense)—

17 " (A) as a direct result of armed conflict;

19 “(C) in the performance of duty under
20 conditions simulating war; or

22 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—Section 1075(b) of title 10,
23 United States Code, as added by subsection (a), shall take
24 effect on the date of the enactment of this Act, and shall

- 1 apply with respect to injuries or diseases incurred on or
- 2 after that date.
