Mr. SPECTER introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

A BILL

To provide for the liquidation or reliquidation of certain entries of fiberboard entered in 2001, 2002, and 2006.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ENTRIES OF CERTAIN FIBERBOARD ENTERED**

4 **IN 2001, 2002, AND 2006.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding section 514 of
6 the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514) or any other pro-
7 vision of law, the Bureau of Customs and Border Protec-
8 tion shall, not later than 90 days after the receipt of the
9 request described in subsection (b), liquidate or reliquidate
10 at a rate of duty of 1.9 cents per kilogram plus 1.5 percent

1 ad valorem for the entries of fiberboard of a density ex-
 2 ceeding 0.8 grams per cubic centimeter described in sub-
 3 section (d).

4 (b) REQUEST.—Liquidation or reliquidation may be
 5 made under subsection (a) with respect to an entry de-
 6 scribed in subsection (d) only if a request is filed with the
 7 Bureau of Customs and Border Protection not later than
 8 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act.

9 (c) REFUND OF AMOUNTS OWED.—Any amounts
 10 owed by the United States pursuant to the liquidation or
 11 reliquidation of an entry described in subsection (d) (in-
 12 cluding interest from the date of entry) shall be refunded
 13 not later than 90 days after the date of such liquidation
 14 or reliquidation.
