Mr. FEINGOLD (for himself and Mrs. BOXER) introduced the following bill;
which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations

A BILL

To provide for the redeployment of United States forces
from Iraq.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REDEPLOYMENT OF UNITED STATES FORCES**
4 **FROM IRAQ.**

5 (a) STATEMENT OF POLICY.—It is the policy of the
6 United States to redeploy United States forces from Iraq
7 by not later than 180 days after the date of the enactment
8 of this Act, while maintaining thereafter in Iraq the mini-
9 mal level of United States forces sufficient to engage di-
10 rectly in targeted counterterrorism activities, train Iraq

1 security forces, and protect United States infrastructure
2 and personnel in Iraq.

3 (b) REPORT.—

4 (1) REPORT ON STRATEGY FOR REDEPLOY-
5 MENT.—Not later than 60 days after the date of the
6 enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Defense and
7 the Secretary of State shall jointly submit to Con-
8 gress a report setting forth the strategy of the
9 United States for the redeployment of United States
10 forces from Iraq by not later than the date that is
11 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act
12 (in this section referred to as the “redeployment
13 date”), in accordance with the policy stated in sub-
14 section (a).

15 (2) ELEMENTS OF STRATEGY.—The strategy
16 set forth in the report under this subsection shall in-
17 clude the following:

18 (A) A flexible schedule for redeploying
19 United States forces from Iraq by the redeploy-
20 ment date, in accordance with the policy stated
21 in subsection (a).

22 (B) An estimate of the number, size, and
23 character of United States military units need-
24 ed in Iraq after the redeployment date, for pur-
25 poses of counterterrorism activities, training

1 Iraq security forces, or protecting United States
2 infrastructure and personnel in Iraq.

3 (C) A strategy for managing the regional
4 implications of the redeployment of United
5 States forces from Iraq in accordance with the
6 policy stated in subsection (a), including a de-
7 scription of proposed efforts to ensure a coordi-
8 nated diplomatic, political, and development
9 strategy to accompany such redeployment of
10 United States forces.

11 (D) A strategy for ensuring the safety and
12 security of United States forces in Iraq during
13 the redeployment under the policy stated in
14 subsection (a), and a contingency plan for ad-
15 dressing dramatic changes in security condi-
16 tions that may require a specified number of
17 additional United States forces to remain in
18 Iraq after the redeployment date.

19 (E) A strategy for repairing and strength-
20 ening United States forces to effectively engage
21 and defeat global terrorist networks that threat-
22 en the United States.

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
