A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to establish a national cemetery for veterans in the Pikes Peak Region of Colorado.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT OF NATIONAL CEMETERY IN
4 THE PIKES PEAK REGION, COLORADO.

5 (a) PIKES PEAK REGION DEFINED.—In this section,
6 the term “Pikes Peak region” means the geographic area
7 consisting of the following counties in Colorado:

8 (1) Teller.

9 (2) El Paso.

10 (3) Fremont.

1 (4) Pueblo.

2 (b) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs
3 shall establish, in accordance with chapter 24 of title 38,
4 United States Code, a national cemetery in the Pikes
5 Peaks region to serve the needs of veterans and their fami-
6 lies.

7 (c) CONSULTATION IN SELECTION OF SITE.—Before
8 selecting the site for the national cemetery to be estab-
9 lished under subsection (b), the Secretary shall consult
10 with—

19 (d) AUTHORITY TO ACCEPT DONATION OF PARCEL
20 OF LAND.—

1 real property, and shall use such parcel to establish
2 the national cemetery under subsection (b).

3 (2) INCOME TAX TREATMENT OF GIFT.—For
4 purposes of Federal income, estate, and gift taxes,
5 the real property accepted under paragraph (1) shall
6 be considered a gift to the United States.

7 (e) REPORT.—As soon as practicable after the date
8 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit
9 to Congress a report on the establishment of the national
10 cemetery under subsection (b). The report shall set forth
11 a schedule for the establishment of the national cemetery
12 and an estimate of the costs associated with the establish-
13 ment of the national cemetery.
