A BILL

To authorize additional funds for emergency repairs and reconstruction of the Interstate I-35 bridge located in Minneapolis, Minnesota, that collapsed on August 1, 2007, to waive the \$100,000,000 limitation on emergency relief funds for those emergency repairs and reconstruction, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ADDITIONAL EMERGENCY RELIEF FUNDING.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Transportation
5 is authorized to carry out a project for the repair and re-

1 construction of the Interstate I-35 bridge located in Min-
2 neapolis, Minnesota, that collapsed on August 1, 2007.

3 (b) FEDERAL SHARE.—The Federal share of the cost
4 of the project carried out under this section shall be 100
5 percent.

6 (c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
7 authorized to be appropriated \$250,000,000 to carry out
8 this section. Such sums shall remain available until ex-
9 pended.

10 **SEC. 2. WAIVER OF EMERGENCY RELIEF LIMITATION.**

11 The limitation contained in section 125(d)(1) of title
12 23, United States Code, of \$100,000,000 shall not apply
13 to expenditures under section 125 of such title for the re-
14 pair or reconstruction of the Interstate I-35 bridge located
15 in Minneapolis, Minnesota, that collapsed on August 1,
16 2007.

17 **SEC. 3. EXPANDED ELIGIBILITY FOR TRANSIT AND TRAVEL
18 INFORMATION SERVICES.**

19 Section 1112 of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Effi-
20 cient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (119
21 Stat. 1171) is amended—

22 (1) by inserting “(a) IN GENERAL.—” before
23 “There”; and

24 (2) by adding at the end the following:

1 “(b) MINNESOTA.—Notwithstanding any provision of
2 chapter 1 of title 23, United States Code, the Secretary
3 may use funds authorized to carry out the emergency re-
4 lief program under section 125 of such title to reimburse
5 the Minnesota State department of transportation for ac-
6 tual and necessary costs of maintenance and operation,
7 less the amount of fares earned, for additional public
8 transportation services and traveler information services
9 which are provided by such department of transportation
10 as a temporary substitute for highway traffic service fol-
11 lowing the collapse of the Interstate I-35 bridge in Min-
12 neapolis, Minnesota, on August 1, 2007, until highway
13 traffic service is restored on such bridge. The Federal
14 share of the cost of activities reimbursed under this sub-
15 section shall be 100 percent.”.
