## A BILL

To require States and Indian tribes to designate specific highway routes for the transportation of hazardous materials and the long-distance transportation of solid waste.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. DESIGNATION OF HAZARDOUS MATERIAL**  
4               **ROUTES.**

5       Section 5112 of title 49, United States Code, is  
6       amended—

7               (1) in subsection (a)—

8                       (A) in paragraph (1), by striking “. How-

9                       ever, the Secretary” and inserting “or if the ve-

1           hicle is a 5-axle single-trailer truck that is haul-  
2           ing solid waste for at least 200 miles along the  
3           National Highway System. The Secretary”; and

4                   (B) in paragraph (2)—

5                       (i) by striking “by subsection (d) of  
6                       this section and section 5125(c) of this  
7                       title, each State and Indian tribe may”  
8                       and inserting “under subsection (f) and  
9                       section 5125(c), and in accordance with  
10                      the standards prescribed under subsection  
11                      (b), each State and Indian tribe shall”;  
12                      and

13                      (ii) in subparagraph (A), by inserting  
14                      “and solid waste” after “hazardous mate-  
15                      rial”; and

16           (2) in subsection (b)(1), by inserting “and solid  
17           waste” after “hazardous material” each place such  
18           term appears.
