Mr. WAMP submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform

RESOLUTION

Expressing support for a national day of remembrance for the workers of the nuclear weapons program of the United States.

Whereas hundreds of thousands of men and women have served the United States in building its nuclear defense since World War II;

Whereas these dedicated American workers paid a high price for their service and many have developed disabling or fatal illnesses as a result of exposure to beryllium, ionizing radiation, toxic substances, and other hazards that are unique to the production and testing of nuclear weapons;

Whereas these workers were unintentionally put at individual risk without their knowledge and consent in order to de-

velop a nuclear weapons program for the benefit of all American citizens;

Whereas these patriotic men and women deserve to be recognized for their contribution, service, and sacrifice towards the defense of our great Nation; and

Whereas October 30, 2009, is the ninth anniversary of the enactment of the Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Act (title XXXVI of Public Law 106–398; 42 U.S.C. 7384 note): Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That the House of Representatives—

2 (1) supports the goals and ideals of a day of re-
3 membrance for the workers of the nuclear weapons
4 program of the United States, including uranium
5 miners, millers, and haulers; and

6 (2) encourages the people of the United States
7 to recognize such a day of remembrance as an op-
8 portunity to support and participate in appropriate
9 ceremonies, programs, and other activities in honor
10 of the past and present workers of the nuclear weap-
11 ons program of the United States.
