A BILL

To amend the Ethics in Government Act of 1978 to establish criminal penalties for knowingly and willfully falsifying or failing to file or report certain information required to be reported under that Act.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. KNOWING AND WILLFUL FALSIFICATION OR**
4 **FAILURE TO REPORT.**

5 Section 104 of the Ethics in Government Act of 1978
6 (5 U.S.C. App.) is amended—

7 (1) by inserting “(1)” after “(a)”; and

8 (2) by adding at the end the following:

1 “(2)(A) It shall be unlawful for any person to know-
2 ingly and willfully falsify, or to knowingly and willingly
3 fail to file or report, any information that such person is
4 required to report under section 102.

5 “(B) Any person who violates subparagraph (A) shall
6 be fined under title 18, United States Code, imprisoned
7 for not more than 1 year, or both.”.

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
