A BILL

To clarify the tariff classification of certain fiberboard core and laminate boards and panels, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. MEDIUM DENSITY FIBERBOARD.**

4 (a) FINDING.—Congress finds that, pursuant to
5 Presidential Proclamation 8097, dated December 27,
6 2006 (72 Fed. Reg. 453), chapter 44 of the Harmonized
7 Tariff Schedule of the United States was amended, effec-
8 tive February 3, 2007, to include laminate boards bonded
9 in whole or in part, or impregnated, with synthetic resins

1 as medium density fiberboard in the article descriptions
 2 for subheadings 4411.12.20, 4411.13.20, and 4411.14.20.

3 (b) RETROACTIVE APPLICATION TO CERTAIN EN-
 4 TRIES.—Notwithstanding section 514 of the Tariff Act of
 5 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514) or any other provision of law, upon
 6 proper request filed with U.S. Customs and Border Pro-
 7 tection before the date that is 90 days after the date of
 8 the enactment of this Act, any entry, or withdrawal from
 9 warehouse for consumption, of any goods described in sub-
 10 heading 4411.12.20, 4411.13.20, or 4411.14.20 of the
 11 Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (as in
 12 effect on the day before the date of the enactment of this
 13 Act) that was made—

14 (1) on or after January 1, 1994, and

15 (2) on or before March 1, 2001,

16 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though the amend-
 17 ment described in subsection (a) applied to the entry or
 18 withdrawal.
