A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on certain synthetic staple fibers that are not carded, combed, or otherwise processed for spinning.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. CERTAIN SYNTHETIC STAPLE FIBERS THAT
4 ARE NOT CARDED, COMBED, OR OTHERWISE
5 PROCESSED FOR SPINNING.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
7 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
8 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
9 new heading:

“	9902.01.00	Acrylic staple fiber composed of less than 85 percent but at least 35 percent by weight of acrylonitrile units, not more than 2 to 3 percent water, imported in the form of non-pigmented (ecru) staple crimped product with an average filament decitex of 1.9 (plus or minus 10 percent), and fiber staple length of 51 mm (plus or minus 10 percent) (provided for in sub-heading 5503.30.00)	Free	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/2011	”.

 2 subsection (a) applies to articles entered, or withdrawn
 3 from warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day
