5 (a) CONSIDERATION OF ACCESS NEEDS OF INDIVIDUALS WITH MOBILITY DISABILITIES.—The Secretary of
6 Agriculture, acting through the Chief of the Forest Service, shall require Forest Service personnel, in implementing off-road vehicle management under the Forest
7 Service Travel Management Rule, to endeavor to accommodate, to the extent consistent with the management objectives and limitations applicable to the National Forest
8 System lands at issue, individuals with mobility disabilities who would need to use a power-driven mobility device for
9 reasonable access to such lands.

16 (b) RESPONSE TO REQUESTS FOR ACCESS.—If, after
17 receiving a request by or on behalf of an individual with
18 mobility disabilities for permission to use a power-driven
19 mobility device to access specific National Forest System
20 lands, Forest Service personnel determine that use of such
21 a power-driven mobility device is not appropriate given the
22 management objectives and limitations applicable to the
23 National Forest System lands at issue, the Forest Service
24 personnel shall provide the individual with a written re-
