Mr. FRANKEN (for himself and Mr. HARKIN) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry

A BILL

To amend the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002 to reauthorize and improve the Rural Energy for America Program.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. RURAL ENERGY FOR AMERICA PROGRAM.**

4 Section 9007 of the Farm Security and Rural Invest-
5 ment Act of 2002 (7 U.S.C. 8107) is amended—

6 (1) in subsection (b)(2)—

7 (A) in subparagraph (C), by striking
8 “and” at the end;

(B) by redesignating subparagraph (D) as subparagraph (E); and

3 (C) by inserting after subparagraph (C)
4 the following:

6 (2) in subsection (c)—

9 “(1) LOAN GUARANTEE AND GRANT PRO-
10 GRAM.—

11 “(A) IN GENERAL.—In addition to any
12 similar authority, the Secretary shall provide
13 loan guarantees and grants to agricultural pro-
14 ducers and rural small businesses—

“(II) unique components of renewable energy systems; and

1 “(i) IN GENERAL.—In providing loan
2 guarantees and grants under this sub-
3 section, the Secretary shall use a 3-tiered
4 application process that reflects the sizes
5 of proposed projects in accordance with
6 this subparagraph.

7 “(ii) TIER 1.—The Secretary shall es-
8 tablish a separate application process for
9 projects for which the cost of the activity
10 funded under this subsection is not more
11 than \$80,000.

12 “(iii) TIER 2.—The Secretary shall
13 establish a separate application process for
14 projects for which the cost of the activity
15 funded under this subsection is greater
16 than \$80,000 but less than \$200,000.

17 “(iv) TIER 3.—The Secretary shall es-
18 tablish a separate application process for
19 projects for which the cost of the activity
20 funded under this subsection is equal to or
21 greater than \$200,000.

22 “(v) APPLICATION PROCESS.—The
23 Secretary shall establish an application,
24 evaluation, and oversight process that is

most simplified for tier I projects and more comprehensive for each subsequent tier.”;

(B) in paragraph (2)—

(i) in subparagraph (C), by inserting “and public health” before “benefits”; and

(ii) by striking paragraph (F) and in-

serting the following:

“(F) the natural resource conservation benefits of the renewable energy system; and”;

(C) in paragraph (3)—

(i) in subparagraph (A), by inserting

“in an amount not to exceed \$100,000 per grant” after “in the form of grants”; and

(ii) by striking subparagraph (C);

(D) in paragraph (4)(C), by striking “75 percent of the cost” and inserting “all eligible costs”; and

(E) by adding at the end the following:

“(5) REQUIREMENT.—In carrying out this section, the Secretary shall not require a second meter on-farm residential portions of rural projects connected to the grid.”;

(3) in subsection (f)—

(A) by striking “Not later” and inserting

the following:

1 “(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later”; and

2 (B) by adding at the end the following:

3 “(2) SUBSEQUENT REPORT.—Not later than 4
4 years after the date of enactment of this paragraph,
5 the Secretary shall submit to Congress a report on
6 activities carried out under this section, including
7 the outcomes achieved by projects funded under this
8 section.”; and

9 (4) in subsection (g)—

10 (A) in paragraph (1)(D), by striking “for
11 fiscal year 2012” and inserting “for each of fis-
12 cal years 2012 through 2017”; and

13 (B) in paragraph (3)—

14 (i) by striking “this section
15 \$25,000,000” and inserting “this sec-
16 tion—

17 “(A) \$25,000,000”;

18 (ii) by striking the period at the end
19 and inserting a “; and”; and

20 (iii) by adding at the end the fol-
21 lowing:

22 “(B) \$100,000,000 for each of fiscal years
23 2013 through 2017.”.
